General Information

AIM understands the vital importance of providing stimulating experiences during your child's first 3 years of life. Our Preschool Readiness Enrichment Program, "PREP", is an inclusion program designed to enhance your child's development in a friendly, nurturing environment. Our language rich curriculum will address all 5 developmental domains: Cognition, Communication, Motor, Self-help and Social.



Our program design is based on a developmental play-based model to address all areas of development. Since play is the *natural work* of children, appropriate and creative play is a critical part of their development. The play model encourages children to make choices and initiate activities that they are interested in.

3:45 - 4:15	Outdoor play/Dramatic play/Fine motor
4:15 - 4:30	Closing circle - Departure

Small Group Activities

Children benefit from Language and Art/Sensory activities in small groups. Teachers are able to interact more closely with each child and work on their specific strengths and needs. The activities can proceed at the child's pace, giving each child the opportunity for full participation.

Staff

The program is staffed by highly qualified individuals with degrees or certificates in Child Development, Early Childhood Education, or related fields, and is managed by a teacher with an MA in Education with a specialization in Early Childhood Special Education. All staff members have experience working with children of this age group, both with and without special needs, and are trained in infant/toddler, child and adult CPR, and first aid.
